

ENGRAVED BENCH FORM

As a supporter of the African American Museum of Bucks County's Commemorative Bench Campaign, you will have the opportunity to leave a legacy by purchasing a bench in your family's and/or organization's honor. These benches will be prominently displayed around our brick patio, or in various shaded areas overlooking our beautifully landscaped property. Your contribution will serve as a symbol of your commitment to preserving African American history right in our own backyard for generations to come.

This classic 4-foot park bench accommodates up to 4 people and is designed to recreate the historic look of the Boone Farm property. Eco-friendly, this cedar-colored bench is made from 100% recycled plastic products and features black coated aluminum frames with quality craftsmanship and coatings. Recycled plastic products are more durable than wood and won't fade, warp, sag, or splinter over time. The plaque is made of heavy cast bronze, designed to last forever outdoors. Plaques are 1/4" thick, featuring a single-line beveled edge border. All characters will appear in upper case Helvetica medium font. Character heights determined by amount of text.
